A VHF radio is a vital piece of safety equipment aboard a boat; anyone intending to go afloat should know how to operate one correctly. Under international law a boat's radio transmitter can only be operated under the control of someone who has a radio certificate; a radio certificate is also a prerequisite for those undertaking the Yachtmaster Coastal or Yachtmaster Offshore exam and for ISA instructor qualifications.

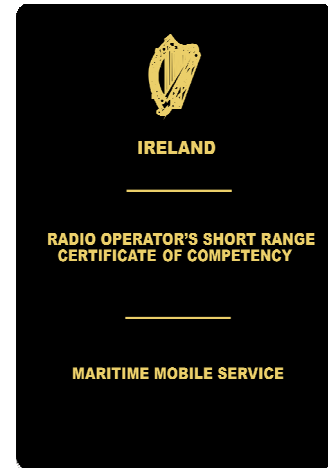
The Short Range Certificate, (SRC), is currently the appropriate VHF certificate for most small craft users.
