



# 29er Irish National Championships



## NOTICE OF RACE

### 1. Rules

- 1.1. The series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 to 2020*.
- 1.2. The prescriptions of the IS or RYA, the rules of 29er Class Association.
- 1.3. The organising authority shall be the National Yacht Club, in conjunction with the Irish 29er Class Association.

### 2. Advertising

- 2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

### 3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The event is open to all current (fully paid up) members of the Irish 29er Class Association, or members of an equivalent 29er National Class Association, or members of the International 29er Class Association. Those members of the Irish 29er class who have yet to pay their €5 membership fee, may do so on the day.
- 3.2. Competitors may apply for a temporary event membership of the Irish 29er Class Association at the event upon payment of €5 per crew member to the Irish 29er Class Association.
- 3.3. All competitors will be deemed to be temporary members of the host club for the duration of the event.
- 3.4. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form and paying the required fee.
- 3.5. Competitors under 18 years of age during the event shall submit signed Parent/Guardian declarations before racing (download forms from the event website)

#### 4. Fees

- 4.1. The entry fee for the event is €100.00. Entries must be made online on [www.nyc.ie](http://www.nyc.ie) before Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June midnight. Late entries (€150) may be accepted by the Organising Authority up to Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> June inclusive. No entry will be accepted thereafter. The entry fee is non-refundable.
- 4.2. Competitors travelling from outside the island of Ireland may have their entry fees waved
- 4.3. Membership fee for the IRL 29er Association is €5.

Races are scheduled (5 per day) with succeeding races being started as soon as practicable after the finish of the previous race.

Depending on conditions, more than 5 races may be held on one day if deemed appropriate.

#### 6. Measurement

- 6.1. A boat or equipment may be measured at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.
- 6.2. Mast head floats will be permitted

#### 7. Sailing Instructions

- 7.1. The sailing instructions will be available at Registration and on [www.nyc.ie](http://www.nyc.ie)

## 8. The Venue

- 8.1. The racing area will be described at the briefing or may be available on the host clubs and/or IRL 29er website prior to the event.

## 9. The Courses

- 9.1. The courses to be sailed will be as described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2. The courses shall be windward/leeward with a target time of 30 minutes.

## 10. Scoring

- 10.1. Two races must be completed to create a valid regatta.
- 10.2. One discard will be applied to the boats overall score after 6 races are sailed, 2 discards if 10 races sailed.
- 10.3. The boats overall score will be the total of all races in the event minus any discards.

## 11. Prizes

- 11.1. Individual prizes will be awarded to the crew and helm of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> boat. Additional prizes will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> under 17y boat, 1<sup>st</sup> all male boat 1<sup>st</sup> all female boat.

## 12. Personal Safety

- 12.1. Mandatory - Each competitor shall carry at all times a SOLAS approved whistle.

## 13. Risk Statement

- 13.1. Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone".
- 13.2. Sailing by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
  - They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
  - They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
  - They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
  - Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;

- The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

#### 14. Insurance

- 14.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of €3,000,000 (or equivalent in Sterling) per incident.

#### 15. Media Rights

- 15.1. Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event. This may include the use of unmanned aerial vehicles (drones) operated under CAA guidelines.
